



#### Monkey Facts

- There are over 250 species of monkeys.
- There are two types of monkeys that live in different parts of the world. The "New World Monkeys" live in South America and the "Old World Monkeys" are from Africa and Asia.
- Some monkeys live in trees, and others live on the ground.
- Different monkeys eat a variety of foods: fruit, leaves, insects, flowers, small mammals, reptiles, amphibians, and crabs.
- Monkeys prefer warm climates and most live in rainforests, except for Australia and New Guinea.
- They are also found in forests, savannahs, deserts and even in snowy mountains.
- Monkeys live in groups called "troops" or "tribes".
- Monkeys come in many different sizes.
- Some monkeys use their tails to grasp things or swing from tree branches.
- Monkeys do NOT make good pets!



Ask your child to press his or her index finger on the ink pad (or in the paint), and then on the white spots on the tree.


Cut on the dotted line and display the artwork!






#### Monkeys like to eat berries!

Draw a line from the letter to the image whose name starts with the letter. For example: "J" is for "Jungle" – draw a line from the letter J to the picture of the Jungle.








## Monkey Puzzle!

- Print on cardstock, cut out puzzle pieces, and keep pieces in a plastic baggie when done playing with the puzzle.

### Matching Game

**First**, cut out the game label on the dotted lines below and glue it on the outside of a letter-sized envelope. **Next**, cut out the instructions and the cards, and store them in the envelope when you are finished playing.

How To Play The Matching Game


Set Up The Game: Shuffle the cards and lay out the cards face down in rows.


**Play:** Player #1 chooses two cards and turns them over. If the two cards are a matching pair, then the player takes the two cards. Player #1 plays until he/she does not make a match.

If the cards are not a match they are turned back over and it is now Player #2's turn. The players continue taking turns until all the cards are played.

How to Win: Collect the most matching pairs.
