A. Introduction to European Russia

1. Read

B. Physical Geography of Russia

1. Where on Earth

- **Find** the continent of Europe and the country of Russia on a globe. Have students color Russia on the map on their folder.
- **Find** Europe and Russia in the Atlas: start on page 76 of Where on Earth? Atlas, then find the country on page 78. Move on to page 80 to view the landscape, and to page 94 to see it by night.

2. Climate, Population and Wildlife

- The **climate** of Russia is mainly continental, with a big arctic section in the north. The east of the country experiences harsh, long, bitterly cold winters. The north of the country is always covered with snow and subject to permafrost. Southern Russia enjoys warm to sometimes hot summers with a lot rainfall, and very cold snowy winters.
