Second - Fourth Grade

British Isles: United Kingdom (England, Scotland, Wales, Northern Ireland) and Ireland

A. Introduction to the British Isles

Suggestion: Have a tea party while you are learning about the British Isles.

1. Read

- Galloping the Globe page 67 and 69 (English vocabulary words)
- <u>A True Book: England</u> (The images in the PDF file provided in the related blog post and my sample cards are based on this book.)
- Children Just Like Me page 26 27

2. Map Folders and Stamp Albums

- Pass out Folders and Stamp Albums.
- Pass out postage stamps from the U.K. and Ireland and stamp hinges.

B. Physical Geography of the British Isles

1. Where on Earth?

- **Find** the continent of Europe and the countries of England, Scotland, Wales, Northern Ireland, and Ireland on a globe. Have students color the British Isles on the map on their folder.
- **Find** Europe and the United Kingdom in the Atlas: start on page 76 of Where on Earth? Atlas, then find the countries on page 78. Move on to page 80 to view the landscape, and to page 94 to see it by night.

2. Climate, Population and Wildlife

- **Review** Europe's overall climate on page 90 of <u>Where on Earth? Atlas</u>. The overall **climate** in England is called temperate maritime: http://projectbritain.com/climate.html.
- **Review** page 92 of <u>Where on Earth? Atlas</u> to see the **wildlife** common across Europe, and don't miss the "**Biomes**" sidebar.
- To see pictures of some of the animals living in the United Kingdom **visit** https://www.britishwildlifecentre.co.uk/planyourvisit/animals.html.
- **Read** page 50 51 of the <u>DK Children's Atlas</u> about The British Isles. **Find out** about British **agricultural** products, major **landforms**, and **water** bodies.
