Nordic Countries: Scandinavia (Norway, Sweden and Denmark), Iceland and Finland

A. Introduction to the Nordic Countries

1. **Read**

- <u>Country Explorers: Norway</u> (The images in the PDF file provided in the related blog post and my sample cards are based on this book.)
- <u>Children Just Like Me</u> page 28 and 36

2. Map Folders and Stamp Albums

- Pass out Folders and Stamp Albums.
- Pass out postage stamps from Norway, Sweden and Denmark, Iceland and Finland, and stamp hinges.

B. Physical Geography of the Nordic Countries

1. Where on Earth

- **Find** the continent of Europe and the countries of Norway, Sweden, Denmark, Finland and Iceland on a globe. Have students color the Nordic Countries on the map on their folder.
- **Find** Europe and the Nordic countries in the Atlas: start on page 76 of <u>Where on Earth? Atlas</u>, then find the countries on page 78. Move on to page 80 to view the landscape, and to page 94 to see it by night.

2. Climate, Population and Wildlife

- **Review** Europe's overall climate on page 90 of <u>Where on Earth? Atlas</u>.
- **Review** page 92 of <u>Where on Earth? Atlas</u> to see the **wildlife** common across Europe, and don't miss the "**Biomes**" sidebar.
- **Read** page 48 49 of the <u>DK Children's Atlas</u> about Scandinavia and Finland. Find Iceland on page 111. **Find out** about **agricultural** products, major **landforms**, and **water** bodies.

 - Listen to an *Around the World Stories* story from the one of the Nordic Countries while working (subscription required: <u>https://www.aroundtheworldstories.com</u>)
 - Flag and Map Country Cover Card PDF File
 - Country Information Card PDF File
 - **Category** Cards plain index cards or pre-printed PDF File (you may want to provide samples for students to copy)
 - Images PDF File for Category Cards
